VOTER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

TO REGISTER TO VOTE IN ARIZONA, YOU MUST BE

- 

1
A United States Citizen
- 


2
An Arizona resident in the county listed on your registration 29 days prior to an election
- 



18 years of age or older before the next general election
- 


4
Able to write your name or make your mark (unless prevented by a disability)

You are unable to register if you have been adjudicated an incapacitated person or have been convicted of a treason or felony (unless you have had your civil rights restored*).

HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE

ONLINE
Visit servicearizona.com and click on "Voter Registration." You will need your valid Arizona Driver License or Identification Card.

2
PAPER FORM
You can download a paper form at azcleaselections.gov/register-to-vote#paperform or pick one up from your county recorder's office or public assistance agencies. Mail your completed registration form to the county recorder.

3
ACTIVE EARLY VOTING LIST (AEVL)
Voters can register for the AEVL to automatically receive a ballot by mail for every election in which they are eligible to vote.

ONCE REGISTERED

Voters receive a registration card in the mail from their County Recorder. It is recommended to review the card to make sure all the information is correct.

*For a first-time felony conviction, civil rights are automatically restored upon completion of a person's sentence and payment of any fines and restitution.
