

VOTERS WITHOUT A PERMANENT HOME



1 I DON'T HAVE A PERMANENT HOME. CAN I STILL VOTE?

Yes! As long as you're qualified and your address is one of the following: A homeless shelter, a temporary place for living (i.e. halfway house, transitional housing etc.), the county courthouse or a general delivery address.

2 AM I QUALIFIED?

Registration requirements:

-  BE A UNITED STATES CITIZEN
-  BE AN ARIZONA RESIDENT
-  BE 18 YEARS OF AGE
-  HAVE NOT BEEN CONVICTED OF FELONY (Unless rights are restored)
-  BE ABLE TO WRITE YOUR NAME (Unless prevented by a disability)

3 HOW DO I REGISTER?

Voters can register online or via a paper form.

To register online you need an AZ Driver License or Identification Card. Visit servicearizona.com and click on "Voter Registration." Public computer terminals are available at county recorder offices and most libraries.

Paper forms can be found at county recorder offices and public assistance agencies. Please refer to the form itself for instructions on how to complete it.

4 HOW DO I RECEIVE MY BALLOT?

Early Voting:

Voters that are on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL), reside in a ballot by mail jurisdiction or have requested a one-time early ballot will receive their ballot in the mail shortly after the start of early voting. You can also vote in person at designated early voting locations!

Election Day Voting:

If your county uses polling places, voters must go to their assigned polling place for their address.

If your county uses vote centers, you may go to any vote center location within your county.

5 WHEN DO I NEED TO UPDATE MY REGISTRATION?

You are required to reregister to vote anytime you move away from your permanent or temporary address, change your name or change your party. If you didn't update your registration prior to an election, you can still vote a provisional ballot, which can then be used to update your registration (as long as you reside within the same county).

Polls are open 6AM - 7PM

Identification is required to vote at the polls!
