

FIRST-TIME VOTER?

Here's a quick guide through the voting process, from registration to Election Day.

1

REGISTER!

In order to vote in any election, you need to be registered to vote 29 days prior to that election.

YOU'RE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN AZ IF:

- You're a U.S. citizen.
- You're a state and county resident 29 days before the election
- You will be 18 years old or older before the next election (yes, you can register before you turn 18)
- You can your write name or make your mark (unless prevented by a disability).

OKAY, I'M ELIGIBLE, NOW WHAT?

- Visit <u>servicearizona.com</u> to register to vote.
- Make sure you have your driver license or ID card on hand
- You can also sign up for the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) to automatically receive your ballot by mail before every election.

YOU'RE **INELIGIBLE** TO VOTE IN AZ IF

- You have been adjudicated an incapacitated person.
- You have been convicted of a treason or a felony, unless you have had your civil rights restored.
- *Note: For a first-time felony conviction, civil rights are automatically restored upon completion of a person's sentence and payment of any fines and restitution.

FIGURE OUT YOUR DISTRICT.

Your district determines which local elections you can vote in and which voting locations you can go to on Election Day.

To find your district, just type in your address at azcleanelections.gov/voter-dashboard

Vote By Mail

If you signed up for the AEVL, your ballot will be mailed out starting 27 days before an election.

To request a ballot by mail for a specific election, contact your county recorder at least 11 days before that election.

Don't forget to sign the affidavit envelope before returning your ballot!
