
Can I still vote if I'm not living at home?

YOU CAN ONLY BE REGISTERED TO YOTE IN ONE LOCATION

So if you move away to go to school, even if you stay in state, you need to decide which address you consider your home address as this determines which district you're in and who you can vote for.

IF YOU ARE TEMPORARILY RESIDING AWAY FROM HOME

You need to contact your county recorder and request your ballot be mailed to you at your temporary address. Or, if you vote in person, make sure you go to the correct voting location for your home address.



IF YOU DECIDE YOUR SCHOOL ADDRESS IS YOUR HOME ADDRESS

You need to go to **servicearizona.com** and update your voter registration information.

YOU'RE **ELIGIBLE** TO VOTE IN AZ IF:

- You're a U.S. citizen
- You're a state and county resident
 29 days before the election
- You will be 18 years old or older before the next election (yes, you can register before you turn 18)
- You can your write name or make your mark (unless prevented by a disability)

OKAY, I'M ELIGIBLE, NOW WHAT?

- Visit <u>servicearizona.com</u> to register to vote
- Make sure you have your driver license or ID card on hand
- You can also sign up for the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) to automatically receive your ballot by mail before every election

YOU'RE **INELIGIBLE** TO VOTE IN AZ IF

- You have been adjudicated an incapacitated person.
- You have been convicted of a treason or a felony, unless you have had your civil rights restored.
- *Note: For a first-time felony conviction, civil rights are automatically restored upon completion of a person's sentence and payment of any fines and restitution.
