KEYWORDS

1. MISINFORMATION

Incorrect or misleading information that is shared by someone who doesn't realize it's wrong. *Example:* A person might accidentally share the wrong date for an election.

2. DISINFORMATION

False information shared on purpose to confuse or trick people, especially to change how they think or vote. *Example:* A fake post saying a candidate dropped out of the race when they didn't.

3. MALINFORMATION

Information that is true but shared in a way that is meant to hurt someone or cause problems. *Example:* Sharing a private email just to embarrass a candidate.

4. STATISTICS

Numbers and facts that are collected and used to explain something. In elections, statistics might show how many people voted or what percent supported each candidate.

5. DEEPPFAKE

A fake video, image, or recording made using technology to look real. It can make it seem like someone said or did something they didn't. This can be used to confuse voters.

6. TRUSTED SOURCE

A person or group that shares accurate and honest information, like a government election website or a well-known news outlet that checks its facts.

7. NONPARTISAN

Not supporting any political party or candidate. Nonpartisan groups focus on giving fair and balanced information to help voters make their own choices.

8. DISENFRANCHISE

To take away someone's right to vote or make it harder for them to vote. *Example:* If there's misinformation about who can vote.

9. ECHO CHAMBER

A situation where someone only hears opinions and information they already agree with, so they don't learn other points of view. Social media can sometimes create echo chambers.

10. MEDIA LITERACY

The ability to find, understand, and check the information you see, especially online or in the news. It helps people tell what's real and what's false.
