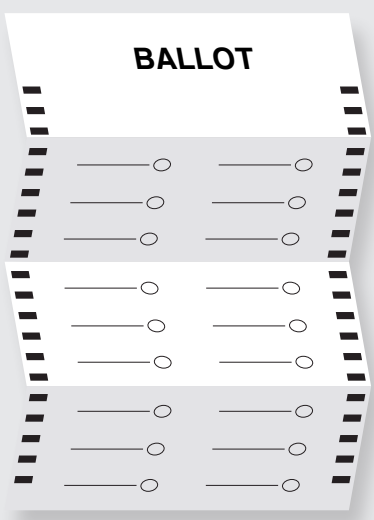


VOTING IN THE PRIMARY ELECTIONS: A GUIDE FOR INDEPENDENTS

In Arizona, Independent voters can participate in open primary elections! Just follow these steps.

STEP 1: PICK A BALLOT



Independents must first choose which party's ballot they want to vote.*
If voting Democratic or Republican, you won't need to reregister.

TIP

Check your voter registration status online! Visit azclean-elections.gov/am-i-registered-to-vote and make any updates by at least 27 days before an election.

STEP 2: DECIDE WHEN TO VOTE

VOTE EARLY



BY MAIL

Independents who vote early by mail must contact their county recorder 11 days before an election to choose a ballot. Mail back your completed ballot 7 days before the election, or drop it off at a voting location in your county by 7pm on Election Night.



IN PERSON

Contact the County Recorder's Office for early voting locations and hours. The last day to vote early in person is the Friday before Election Day.

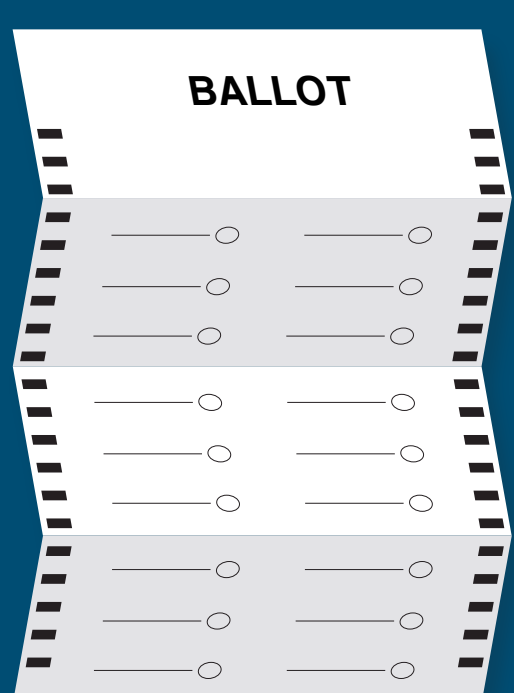

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

Ask your poll worker for the party ballot of your choice on Election Day. Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Be sure to bring your ID!

WHICH BALLOT DO I GET?



Democratic Party	→	Democratic Party Ballot
Green Party	→	Green Party Ballot
Libertarian Party	→	Libertarian Party Ballot
Republican Party	→	Republican Party Ballot
No Labels Party	→	No Labels Party Ballot*
Independent Voter (No Party Affiliation)	→	Choose One: Democratic, Republican, or local non-partisan (if available)
