

Rank out of 35 Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development Nations in voting. Right behind Estonia.






THE U.S. FLAWED DEMOCRACY



IN 2016

- 45% of eligible voters did not vote in the election!








2016 GENERAL ELECTION








% OF ELIGIBLE VOTERS - 2016 GENERAL ELECTION








2016 PRIMARY ELECTION







% OF ELIGIBLE VOTERS - 2016 PRIMARY ELECTION








U.S. VOTER PARTICIPATION






VOTER TURNOUT

20 - 30% in the 2016 Presidential Primary Election.








Local elections have more immediate impacts, yet turnout rates are among the lowest.

ARIZONA'S VOTER LANDSCAPE: MILLENNIALS


THE CONTRADICTION:

- 19.45 percent of 'cast' votes








VOTING CORRELATES TO EDUCATION LEVEL

28%








Voters are not like 'non-voters'

- The less well educated, poorer, non-white citizen feels alienated from the democratic process and yet needs the most representation.








The non-Hispanic Caucasian population is declining.

Replacement voters are needed for disappearing voters.



Didn't know I could vote	4%	
Didn't know how to vote	2%	
Other	29%	31%





REGISTERED VOTERS WHO DID NOT VOTE SAID:

- Voters are emotionally disconnected
- Lack of sufficient news media coverage
- Process is too complex
- Low level of trust
- Lack of faith in the system
- Lack of candidate options
- Lack of identification with candidates
- Lack of understanding







NURTURE THE VOTER PIPELINE

- More engagement
- Early exposure to voting
- More guidance and actionable steps
- More education on the process
- More easy-to-use tools







- Protect voter trust
- Report more on candidates, initiatives & ballot measures
- Make voting a family affair
- Prioritize civics in the classroom
- Engage in real dialogue with voters
- Implement policies that are fair
- Give real access to voters
