# Voter & Public Education

The Commission continued to provide information to the public regarding participation in the political process, Clean Elections participation and the functions and purposes of the Clean Elections Act. This was accomplished through education campaigns throughout the two local elections and the statewide Primary and General Elections, along with grassroots and social media outreach. The Commission consistently provides election information on how, where and when to vote.

The Commission's education and outreach efforts for 2018 included:

## **Educating the Voters. Educating the Candidates.**

In addition to educating the voters, the Commission strives to educate candidates running for office.

The Commission hosts candidate training workshops that include details about campaign finance reporting and debate participation.

The Commission spends 10% of the expenditure cap on voter education in accordance with its statutory requirements. See page 9 of this report for more financial information.

# Connections Campaign

The emphasis of the 2018 Voter Education Campaign was to connect the voters to the issues and candidates. The goal of the Connections Campaign was to motivate Arizona voters to vote informed in state and local elections by demonstrating the tangible and emotional benefits of casting their ballot. The outreach efforts included social media, television, radio, print, digital and online ads. All of the creative designed for this campaign consistently utilized an arrow to connect voters to the ballot and each other, along with different environments/communities found throughout Arizona.




# 18 in 2018 Campaign

The 18 in 2018 Campaign was a unique way to encourage the younger generation to engage in the political process and increase voter registration among 18-24 year olds. These efforts culminated in a “Take Flight” mural, painted by Lauren Lee, in downtown Phoenix. The wings symbolize coming of age and taking flight into adulthood. There was also a wheat pasting of the mural in Tucson, at Scottsdale Community College and Mesa Community College. Through the Shazam app, the mural had an augmented reality feature that made the wings come to life and animate. At the end of the experience, there was a link taking the user to register to vote. This campaign resulted in approximately 3,500 voter registrations, generating 566+ pieces of publicly shared “user generated content” on Instagram, which together accumulated approximately 68 thousand likes and over 3,250 comments!



# Independent Voter Campaign

The Independent Voter Campaign was created to increase awareness of the actions Independent Voters need to take in order to participate in Arizona's primary election, which took place on August 28th. Arizona has an "open primary" which allows voters registered as Independent to participate by designating to their County Recorder which partisan ballot they would like to receive. The methods utilized throughout this campaign included social media postings, print ads, an infographic and more!




The **August 28** Arizona Primary is an open election.

# Website Re-Design & Voter Dashboard

The Voter Education program has significantly expanded throughout recent years, resulting in increased website content. To keep up with the amount of information our site houses the Commission underwent a website re-design at the start of 2018, to better optimize content, layout and accessibility. Notable changes were the new page hierarchy and website structure, which is evidenced by the menu categories at the top navigation and a search feature, which allows voters to quickly access exactly what they were looking for.

Also making it's debut in 2018 was the Commission's newest tool, the "Voter Dashboard". The dashboard is the Commission's most comprehensive and user-friendly resource delivering tailored information directly to voters. The Voter Dashboard can be quickly accessed on a laptop, tablet, or mobile phone via its responsive design which reconfigures to the screen size of any device. Voters need only type in their home address to immediately receive customized elections details specific to their geographic location.



# Customer Relationship Management (CRM)

Another new feature provided by the Commission is the Customer Relationship Management (CRM) program, more commonly referred to as our voting reminders. Voters now have the ability to opt in for email notifications. These notifications contain election information, relevant deadlines and helpful links to other tools the Commission provides. This also grants the Executive Director the ability to communicate with the citizens participating in the program in case of a pertinent election update. 

# Candidate Statement Pamphlet

Candidate Statement Pamphlets were created, printed, and distributed to voters in the primary and general elections. The pamphlets contained a 200-word statement and a picture from each statewide and legislative candidates. The Commission distributed 2,023,107 copies of the Primary election pamphlet and another 2,026,841 copies of the General election pamphlet, for a total of 4,049,948, to households containing a registered Arizona voter. For the Primary election there were a total of 234 statements submitted, out of 242 eligible candidates (96.7%). Whereas the guide for the General election contained 172 submitted statements, out of 176 eligible candidates (97.7%).


After it's initial success the Commission again utilized "district specific" pamphlets, which created a more user-friendly experience for the voters. The layout of the pamphlet was also reorganized to simplify and better explain the process.



# Clean Elections

## Training & Guides

Education is a core component of the Commission. In 2018, the Commission continued to provide information to interested groups and potential candidates through speaking engagements, training workshops, as well as through publications on our enhanced agency website. Each election cycle the Commission develops a guide to assist participating candidates as they navigate the political campaign process and to inform non-participating candidates, and other groups involved in elections, about the Clean Elections Act and rules. The guide covers important topics such as requirements of the Clean Elections Act and Rules, filing and reporting deadlines, how to become a Clean Elections participating candidate, and how to qualify for funding.



Participating candidates are required to attend one Clean Elections Candidate Training Workshop during the election cycle. The workshops are open to the public and designed to provide information to prospective candidates, or those who are assisting participating candidates, about the requirements of the Clean Elections Act.

# Candidate Debates

Debates in the 2018 Election Cycle were held for both the Primary and General Elections. A debate was conducted for every contested Statewide and Legislative office that included a participating candidate or upon the request of a traditional candidate. This year Clean Elections was able to partner with high schools and The Arizona Capitol Times.

Voters were able to participate in the debate process in a number of ways. Statewide debates were televised on Arizona Horizon, all legislative debates were open to the public, recorded for on demand viewing and live streamed when available. Voters were able to submit questions for candidates via the Clean Elections website and the smart device app. These new initiatives have allowed us to expand the debate program and to get the community involved more than ever before. The livestreams collectively reached approximately 16,755 people throughout the state! There were a total of 30 debates held in the Primary Election and 34 for the General Election.



# Voter Crisis Report

A new report, commissioned by Clean Elections and authored by the ASU Morrison Institute for Public Policy, explores how Arizona has much room for improvement when it comes to participation in elections. The findings were assembled in the publication titled “Arizona’s Voter Crisis”. This report indicates that non-voters are the ones actually determining elections. When compared to other states, Arizona ranks 43<sup>rd</sup> in voter participation. The report discusses Arizona’s electoral and political landscape as well as discussing steps that could help improve participation. The report can be downloaded on the [Commission’s website](#).



# Website & Social Media

The Commission had a significant increase in its engagement with voters online. Utilizing social media channels has allowed the Commission to instantly connect with voters on timely and important election related issues. Voters and candidates alike can follow the Commission on social media for more information about elections and running for office.

Social media sites such as Twitter, YouTube and Facebook were utilized and the chart below displays the amount of followers/likes throughout the previous years.

Clean Elections is funded by voluntary contributions and surcharges on criminal penalties and violations, such as traffic tickets.

Not a single dollar of Clean Elections funding comes from the State's General Fund.

Rather than taking money from taxpayers, Clean Elections has donated \$74 million to the State's General Fund since its inception through 2016.

The removal of the \$5 check-off box on Arizona state income tax return forms and dollar-for-dollar tax credits caused a decrease in revenue to the Clean Elections Fund, and as a result the Commission was unable to transfer excess monies to the General Fund in 2018.

\*Previously, Arizona citizens could contribute voluntarily through a \$5 check-off box on Arizona state income tax return forms and through dollar for dollar tax credits. This portion of the Act was removed in 2012; however, late tax filers may still contribute.

\*\*The Clean Elections Commission operates on a calendar year budget rather than the State's fiscal year budget.

# Financial Information

## Revenue Sources

Citizens Clean Elections Commission revenue comes from the following sources:

- 10% surcharge on all civil penalties and criminal fines
- Civil penalties paid by candidates.
- \$5 qualifying contributions collected from participating candidates.

## Controls on Spending

The Commission's total expenditures cannot exceed seven times the number of Arizona resident personal income tax returns filed during the previous calendar year. Up to 10% of the total expenditure cap for administration and enforcement purposes may be used. The Commission may make public education paid media expenditures up to 10% of the total expenditure cap as well. (A.R.S. §16-949) The 2018 expenditure caps were as follows:

- Total Expenditure Cap: \$20,668,270
- Administration & Enforcement Cap: \$2,066,827
- Public Education Expenditure Cap: \$2,066,827

# 2018 Candidate Summary

During the Primary election 245 candidates sought statewide and legislative offices, with 69 of those individuals participating in the Clean Elections system. The Clean Elections candidate participation rate was 28% in the Primary election.

During the General election there were 174 candidates seeking statewide and legislative offices, 49 of which were participating candidates. The Clean Elections candidate participation rate was 28% in the General election.

In 2018, more than \$3.7 million was distributed from the Clean Elections Fund to participating candidates.

The following pages list the candidates for statewide and legislative office who raised funds and qualified for the ballot. Please note each state legislative district elects two representatives to serve in the House of Representatives and one senator to serve in the Senate. 
## Arizona's Citizens Clean Elections Act

The public financing system is voluntary; candidates who choose to participate in this system to receive public funding are known as participating candidates. Candidates who choose to raise private campaign funds are known as non-participating/traditional candidates.

To become a Clean Elections participating candidate, a candidate must raise a number of \$5 qualifying contributions during a defined qualifying period. Clean Elections participating candidates agree to forgo contributions from political action committees.

# 2018 PRIMARY ELECTION CANDIDATE LISTING

Reallocation Notice: Pursuant to A.R.S. §16-952(D), a one-party-dominant legislative district is a district in which the number of registered voters registered in the party with the highest number of registered voters exceeds the number of registered voters to each of the other parties by an amount at least as high as ten percent of the total number of voters registered in the district. In 2018, qualifying legislative candidates received \$16,995 in funding for the primary. Legislative candidates who were eligible, and chose to reallocate, received \$25,493 for the primary instead of the general election. Candidates are eligible to reallocate their funding if they are in a one-party dominant district, are in the dominant party, and have a contested primary election.



In 2018, qualifying legislative candidates received \$16,995 in funding for the primary. Legislative candidates who were eligible, and chose to reallocate, received \$25,493 for the primary instead of the general election. Candidates are eligible to reallocate their funding if they are in a one-party dominant district, are in the dominant party, and have a contested primary election.

# Enforcement, Audits & Litigation

The Commission enforces the Citizens Clean Elections Act and Commission rules which are a part of the Arizona Administrative Code. The Act and Commission rules contain specific campaign finance provisions and limitations.

Commission staff monitor campaign finance reports to ensure campaign spending occurs as specified by the Act and Rules. The Commission has the authority to subpoena witnesses, take evidence, and require, by subpoena, the production of any books, papers, records or other material relevant to an enforcement matter.

Potential penalties for violations of the Act range from monetary penalties, the disqualification of a candidate or forfeiture of office. Most enforcement matters are settled amicably.

The Commission also conducts audits to ensure compliance with the Act and Commission rules. The audits are completed by an independent auditing agency. Candidate audits are conducted during election years after the Commission has disbursed funds to qualified candidates.

In 2018, the Commission approved audits for all participating candidates. Candidates that did not advance to the General Election were audited in the Primary Election. Candidates that advanced to the General Election were audited after the election took place.

## Enforcement

The Commission acts on both external and internally filed complaints.

During 2018, the Commission resolved 13 complaints arising from the 2016 election cycle.

# Rulemaking & Legislation

## Commission Rulemaking Authority

In accordance with A.R.S. §16-956(C), the Commission may adopt rules to carry out the purposes of the Citizens Clean Elections Act.

The Commission proposes and adopts rules in public meetings, with at least sixty days allowed for interested parties to comment after the rules are proposed. After consideration of the comments received in the sixty day comment period, the Commission may adopt the rule in an open meeting.

The Commission diligently makes changes to its rules and procedures to address concerns and improve the functions of the program. Rules adopted by the Commission are not effective until January 1 in the year following the adoption of the rule. However, rules adopted by unanimous vote may be immediately effective and are enforceable.

In 2018, the Commission did not make amendments to any rules.

## Vision Statement

Through the successful implementation of the Arizona Citizens Clean Elections Act, the Commission seeks to improve the integrity of Arizona state government and promote public confidence in the Arizona political process.

# 2018 Legislation



The Commission adopted the following legislative principles and priorities in an effort to improve the Act and Commission procedures:

**Oppose efforts to defund, eliminate or limit the Citizens Clean Elections Act and/or the Commission.** Over several sessions, members of the legislature have proposed measures that seek to defund, limit, or eliminate the authority of the Act or the Commission itself. The Commission has historically opposed these efforts on the grounds that they are typically poorly constructed, misleading, or otherwise ill-considered. The Commission works to maintain the letter and spirit of the law and supports efforts that further the purpose of the Act. Specifically the Commission opposes the following:

- Superseding 16-941(D), -942(B) and 16-901.01
- Attempts to limit the power the Commission has to enforce the Act
- Monitor expanding the Elections Procedures Manual

**Support election law reforms.** Elections issues continue to percolate through both the political and legal process. The Commission continues to support reforms including improving the public financing program; improving the campaign finance code to ensure that voters are receiving information about the identity and contributions of campaign contributors and expenditures, including independent expenditures; ensuring that changes improve the State's anti-corruption, anti-circumvention and informational interests, the Clean Elections Act and the Commission's independence; and improving voter access to information, voter involvement and voting.

# 2018 Legislation

**Support improvements to voter education and access.** The Commission has supported efforts to enhance voter education and participation through legislation that advance the anti-corruption and public participation values that undergird the Act. The Commission continues to express its support for legislation that advances these aims.

# Looking Forward to 2019

The Commission will continue its voter education efforts in 2019 by offering voters a comprehensive education plan that focuses on how to participate in the electoral process, voting informed and the importance of voting in local elections. ### **2020 Education Plan Preview**

2020 will be a presidential election year and therefore Arizona will conduct it's Presidential Preference Election in addition to it's regular primary and general. The Commission will develop and host detailed information pertaining to all of these elections to better assist the electorate!

## Commission Structure & Mission

The Citizens Clean Elections Commission was established by the enactment of the Citizens Clean Elections Act, A.R.S., Title 16, Chapter 6, Article 2. In addition to administering the provisions of Article 2, the Commission promulgates rules and enforces A.R.S. §§ 16-940 through 16-961.

The Commission's mission is to fairly, faithfully and fully implement and administer the Citizens Clean Elections Act.

The Citizens Clean Elections Commission consists of five members. All members must be registered to vote in the State of Arizona. No more than two members of the commission may be members of the same political party. No more than two members of the commission may be residents of the same county.

# Commissioner Biographies

## **Mark Kimble - Independent - Pima County**

Senate Democratic Leader Katie Hobbs appointed Mark Kimble, an Independent, to the Citizens Clean Elections Commission in July 2015. Mark was a longtime journalist in Southern Arizona. After graduating from the University of Arizona with a bachelor's degree in journalism, Mark worked for the Associated Press and then for the Tucson Citizen newspaper. During a 35-year career at the Citizen, he was a reporter, city editor, assistant managing editor and associate editor-columnist in charge of the editorial page. When the Citizen closed in 2009, Mark went to work as senior press advisor and later as communications director for Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords.
